Saturday 17 <sup>th</sup> January 10:00am	<b>The Search for the Brown Hairstreak,</b> starting at Stonelink Farm, Stubb Lane, Brede (TQ842183). Brown Hairstreak has not been recorded in Rother for many years but that's not to say they aren't here! The females descend from tree-tops to lay eggs on blackthorn. We'll search the excellent blackthorn hedges at Stonelink Farm for the tiny white eggs, and then move off to search hedgerows at another excellent location. Suitable for all levels - beginners to experts.
Saturday 25 <sup>th</sup> April 10:30am	<b>Identifying and Recording Butterflies</b> , Brede High Woods (meet in the main car park, TQ804205). Free workshop and walk for people interested in taking part in Rother Woods butterfly surveys. These workshops give you all the preparation you need in identification and survey techniques for recording butterflies and day-flying moths in the Rother area. Suitable for all levels - beginners to experts. <b>Booking essential</b> .
Saturday 2 <sup>nd</sup> May 10:30am	<b>Identifying and Recording Butterflies</b> , Beckley Woods (Entrance via Horseshoe Lane, between Beckley and Udimore). An alternative to the previous event, a free workshop for people interested in helping to record butterflies in the Rother Woods. This walk will give you a good grounding in identification and survey techniques for butterflies and day-flying moths. Suitable for all levels - beginners to experts. <b>Booking essential</b> .
Saturday 9 <sup>th</sup> May 10:30am	<b>Tillingham Valley Butterfly Hunt</b> , Starting at Stockwood Farm near Staplecross (TQ800218) we'll look at a range of good butterfly habitats, before dispersing along this stunning valley to record the butterflies. At the end of the day we'll regroup at a local pub to share our findings. Suitable for all levels - beginners to experts. Transport useful. <b>Booking essential</b> .
Friday 22 <sup>nd</sup> May to Sunday 24 <sup>th</sup> May	<b>The Big Little Butterfly Festival</b> , This will be a series of butterfly events held over 3 days to coincide with the RX Wildlife Festival at Rye. There will be butterfly recording, night-time bat and moth hunts, events for children and a big butterfly BBQ (we won't be cooking big butterflies).
